1. What is WeC.A.R.E.?

WeC.A.R.E. is an online, international teacher training and classroom intervention program that aims to enhance the students' psychological wellbeing, build resilience, foster team-spirit, and create a global support network of educators, psychologists and students (http://www.connecting4caring.gr/en/content/description-4).

WeC.A.R.E. is part of the larger, multi-level prevention, awareness-building, education and intervention project Connecting for Caring http://www.connecting4caring.gr created and implemented by the Society for School and Family Consultation and Research in Athens, Greece http://www.esose.gr, in cooperation with the Center for Research and Practice in School Psychology of the University of Athens http://www.centerschoolpsych.psych.uoa.gr, with the generous donation of Stavros Niarchos Foundation during the years 2012-2014.

The main Goals of WeC.A.R.E.

- To support children, teachers and schools, especially during the difficult times of economic hardship and other unsettling events.
- To create bridges that will promote cultural understanding, collaboration and collective action.

- To build resilience and foster positive attitude in the classroom.
- To build an international network of schools as caring communities, in collaboration with university faculty members and psychological associations in Greece, USA and other countries.

2. Why should WeC.A.R.E.?

Children today are faced with a large number of major challenges that can have a detrimental effect on their psychological wellbeing and learning. Training and intervention programs such as WeC.A.R.E. can effectively help children through these challenges.

Major Global Challenges

- Loss or reduced incomes, unemployment of pare
- Economic crisis affecting many countries
- Limited access to medical and mental health care
- Migration and refugees
- Violence in schools and communities
- Limited educational opportunities
- Limited provision of school psychological services
- Lack of in service teachers' training

Negative Outcomes for Children

- Increased emotional and behavioral problems
- Drop out
- ▶ Bullying and violence in schools
- Drug use



School intervention programs minimize negative outcomes (risk factors) and promote protective factors in students' lives by helping all children to achieve school success and develop positive life skills that will prepare them for a successful adult life (Biglan, Flay, Embry, & Sandler, 2012; Zins, Weissberg, Wang, & Walberg, 2004).

3. Who can participate?

- Any teacher of a kindergarten, elementary school or junior high school class from an institution anywhere in the world where Greek is taught.
- Requirements for participating:
 - basic computer knowledge (i.e. accessing the internet, using email, ability to download pdf and other audio, video, or text files) and internet access in order to be able to access the training material and communicate with our expert psychologists team, as well as the other program participants.
 - > personal e-mail account
 - internet access in the classroom (or other accessible part of the school) at least once a month in order to use the online interactive game Sailling4Carring with the students.

Note: The material and activities are adapted for each class level and are available both in Greek and in English.

4. How is the program structured and what is the time commitment required?

The classrooms that participate in WeC.A.R.E. are divided in groups of 4 or 5 classes from different countries – at least 2 in each group are from Greece. Together they make an online sailing journey passing through a series of islands-stations inspired by Ancient Greek Literature and Mythology (e.g. "The journey of Odysseus"). Each island station constitutes the platform for each of the modules of the program.



WeC.A.R.E. 2013-2014 consists of 5 monthly modules on the following topics:

- a) Building psychological resilience and fostering positivity
- b) Recognizing, expressing and regulating emotion
- c) Coping with stress and anxiety
- d) Understanding diversity
- e) Closing project

Each module consists of an online training and preparation session for the teacher, 2 in-class activities and a joint project. The program preparation materials will be available online through the interactive online platform http://www.connecting4caring.gr/milesplus

a) Teacher Training and Preparation (approximately 2 hours per month)

- Viewing training videos (webinars)
- Viewing videos with instructions for the in-class activities
- Reading material
- Preparing the materials for the in-class activities
- Answering a short questionaire on the material

Note: the videos and other materials for each module are uploaded once a month and each teacher can access, prepare and implement the activities in their class anytime before that month's deadline.

b) In-class Intervention: 2 In-class Activities (2-3 class sessions per month)

Performing the activity with the students in class according to the instructions. Each activity is planned to last one class session but a teacher may devote more time to an

activity if they find it necessary (Examples 2013-2014: http://www.connecting4caring.gr/en/content/examples-implementation-program)

c) Joint Project (1 class session per month)

One of the key innovative features of the WeC.A.R.E. program is the interactive online game Sailing4Caring http://www.connecting4caring.gr/en/content/interactive-game-1 through which students make a virtual journey on board the WeC.A.R.E. School Boat. Each class inhabits a cabin along with the other 3 or 4 classes from Greece & other countries worldwide. Through the Sailing4Caring game the classes can communicate, collaborate on their group projects, and share their work with their peers from around the world.

The joint project consists in formatting and uploading the product of the second inclass activity together with the product of the other classes in the group. It does not require extra work in terms of preparation, but rather, it is a collaborative synthesis of what has come out of the second in-class activity. For example if the second activity of a particular module produced a collection of photographs, the joint project could consist in having each class upload these photographs on a larger online group album. Teachers that form a 2 or 3 member group can communicate via our online forum be creative in the way in which they will put this material together. The classes' interaction and sharing of material will take place via the online game platform "Sailing for Caring"

5. How do I get support?

The teachers who participate in the WeC.A.R.E. program, apart from being paired with three or four other teachers and their classes, they are also placed in a larger group of teachers (approximately 15 members) with whom they can interact via our online platform. The platform includes a **supervision forum**, where teachers can ask questions or comment on the implementation of the program and receive support from our specialized group of Psychologists throughout the course of the program. Live supervision is also an option.

6. How has WeC.A.R.E. achieved its goals so far?

Since the start of the program in 2012 Greek-speaking teachers and students from all over the world were connected with teachers and students from Greece, shared their ideas, and collaborated creatively on group projects.

A multilevel assessment model was developed for the WeC.A.R.E. program evaluation, which included process and outcome evaluation by both teachers and students. Analysis of the evaluation data suggest that the WeC.A.R.E. program significantly benefited both teachers and students.

In particular, teachers reported that following the implementation of the program the students appeared to:

- a) Cooperate more with their schoolmates
- b) To behave with mutual respect
- c) To support each other more.
- d) Recognize and express their feelings
- e) Improve their social skills
- f) Improve their interpersonal relationships
- g) Foster intercultural understanding
- e) Improve their school performance

More specifically, teacher participants of the WeC.A.R.E. program reported:

- "The theoretical and practical training of the program helped me find better ways to handle my emotions both in and outside school."
- "Implementing the program in my class this year has taught me methods of enhancing positive classroom climate that I plan to continue using in my classes from now on."
- "I feel more confident as a teacher and better able to handle difficult situations with my students."
- "The program helped to strengthen my students' relationships and to understand and accept each others' feelings. Additionally, they realized that their classmates and peers from other schools share the same concerns."
- "The program gave my students the opportunity to get to know themselves and each other better and to come closer. Now they feel more comfortable acknowledging and expressing their emotions."
- "Through the WeC.A.R.E. program my students learned better ways to handle their emotion. They realized that they are not the only ones who feel stressed, sad or worried. They became a stronger team. They got to know both themselves and their peers better."

Students participants of the WeC.A.R.E. program reported:

- "Meeting students from other countries and schools gave us the chance to found that adolescents who live in different countries can be quite different in character or habits but they have the same feelings and express the same concerns.
- "I learned to cooperate better with other students".
- "We came closer to each other in a different way and we realized that sometimes the people next to us are in need for a good word or a smile more often than we thought."
- "I realized how I can acknowledge and protect my emotions."

"I learned effective techniques for handling stress."

7. Do I receive certification?

Following successful completion of the program the teacher will be awarded a Certificate of Attendance for **90 hours of continuing education training.** In order to receive certification participants need to have implemented the program in full and to have completed the neccessary in-class activites and questionnaires within the appropriate deadlines.

8. How much does it cost to participate?

Starting from this year, the Greek-speaking schools and teachers from around the world become the key allies of the program as have a change not only to participate for a small fee, but also, if they can and wish to do so, to offer their much needed support to schools in Greece by sponsoring their participation! ^{*} Participation of more than one teacher per school increases the effectiveness of the program in strengthening psychological resilience and positive climate in the school community as a whole.
